"UK Conformity Assessed" mark

- CE Marking has applied to products supplied into the UK since the 1990's...
- ➤ The UK left the European Union on 31st January 2020
- UKCA marking has come into force in Great British (GB) from 1st January 2021
- CE marking will be recognized in GB until 31 December 2024*

UK Regulations

<u>Initially</u> the UK and EU requirements remained <u>identical</u> from a technical perspective...

Many EU regulations require the use of an EU appointed "**Notified Body**" to perform product inspections and/or conduct factory quality inspections as part of the attestation process. UK regulations have the same requirement but this activity now must be performed by a UK-appointed **"Approved Body"** such as BSI

Affixing the UKCA Marking to a product declares compliance with <u>all relevant **UK**</u> <u>Regulations</u>

Markings can be combined...



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Indefinite extension of CE marking recognition for some* products

On 1 Aug. 2023 the UK government announced the extension of recognition beyond December 2024. This update apply to the UK regulations on:

- toys
- pyrotechnics
- recreational craft and personal watercraft
- simple pressure vessels
- electromagnetic compatibility
- non-automatic weighing instruments
- measuring instruments
- measuring container bottles
- lifts
- equipment for potentially explosive atmospheres (ATEX)
- radio equipment

- pressure equipment
- personal protective equipment (PPE)
- gas appliances
- machinery
- equipment for use outdoors
- aerosols
- low voltage electrical equipment

* There are different rules for: medical devices, construction products, cableways, transportable pressure equipment, unmanned aircraft systems, rail products, marine equipment and ecodesign



Placing Products on the NI Market



- The Ireland/Northern Ireland Protocol is in force since 1st Jan. 2021.
- Goods placed on the market in NI will need to meet relevant EU rules.
- The CE marking will be accompanied by the UKNI marking <u>when assessed by a UK</u> <u>Approved body</u>.
- The UKNI is never applied on its own. It always accompanies the relevant EU conformity marking.
- The UKCA marking alone will not be valid for the NI market.



Summary

- All UK Notified Bodies became UK Approved Bodies from 1 January 2021
- For the EU we have Notified Bodies and for the UK we have Approved Bodies
- Notified Bodies are listed on NANDO and Approved Bodies are listed on UKMCAB
- Existing EU legislation and scopes have *initially* been mirrored for Approved Bodies
- Former UK Notified Bodies may have an EU Notified Body within the structure of their organization
- The harmonized EN standards have *initially* been mirrored in the UK <u>designated standards</u> (*minor differences already present*), see <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/designated-</u> <u>standards#references-of-designated-standards</u>
- For many product categories, CE marking will be accepted in the UK beyond 31 Dec. 3024
